GENERAL INFORMATION

CONCEPT

Care of the injured athlete demands the full attention and concern of the entire Sports Medicine Team: the coach, trainer, physical therapist, and physician. Foremost in the minds of this team approach should be the prevention of injur-ies, followed by appropriate treatment and rehabilitation of the athlete. The course provides a forum for the Sports Medicine Team to discuss problems and concepts relating to preventing, treating, and rehabilitating injured athletes. Emphasis is placed on preventing injury by conditioning and the use of proper equipment. Commonly occurring problems and injuries relating to the upper and lower extremities will be reviewed. The format will include illustrated lectures, panels, and discus-sions. There will be videotape demonstrations of taping, protective equipment, and rehabilitation. Special workshops will include hands-on experience in tap-ing, rehabilitation, and examination as well as knee and shoulder anatomy dissection laboratories. Participants are encouraged to bring problem cases and situations for discussion by the faculty during the question-and-answer periods. A certification course in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation will also be offered.

- Diagnose commonly occurring injuries and advise the athletes regarding their treatment.

- Develop comprehensive rehabilitation regimens following injuries to athletes.
